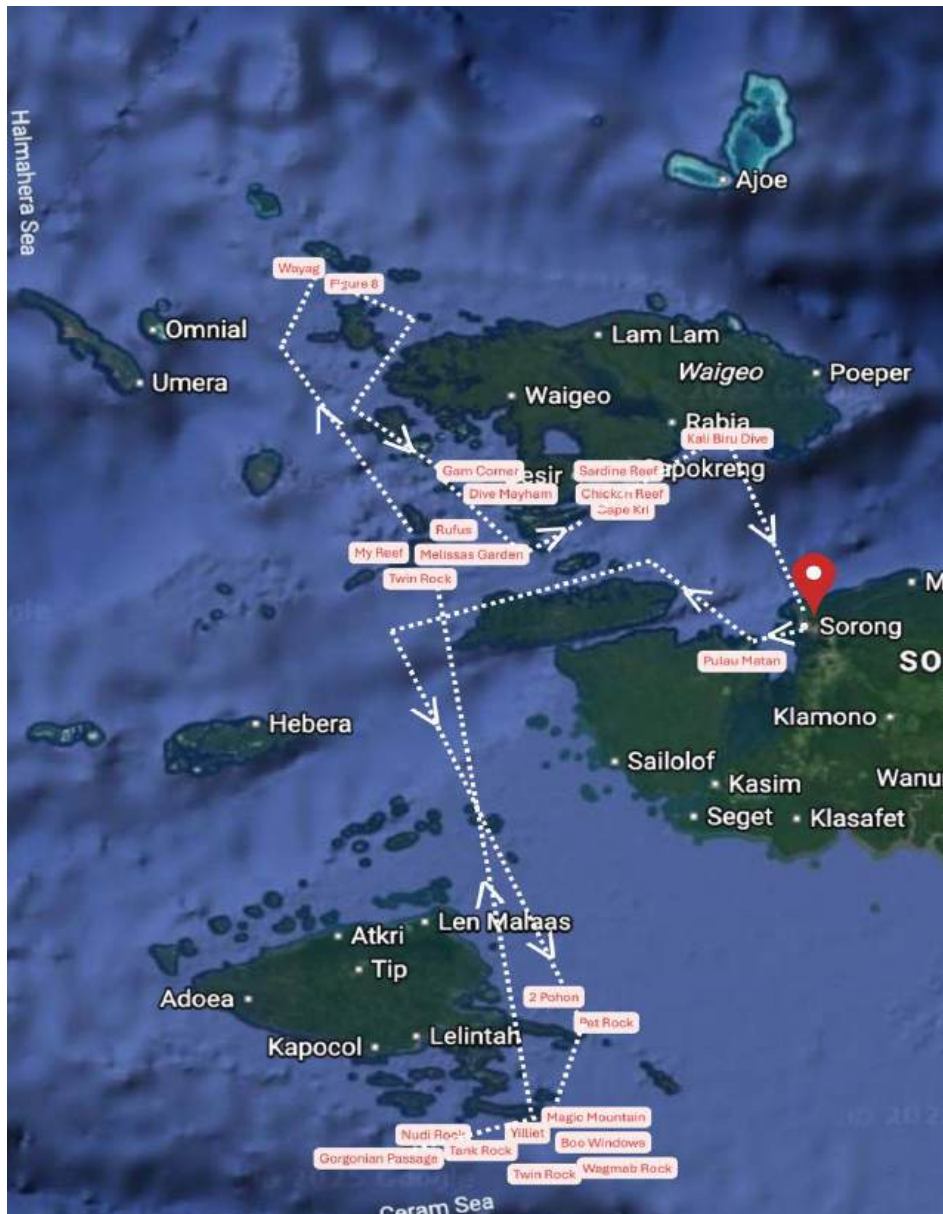
I am pleased to finally provide you with the latest information and data for our Indonesia trip 2027.

Travel period: 03.03.2027 (Airport Sorong und check in)
13.03.2027 (check out until 3 pm and transfer to Sorong Airport)

Together we will spend 11 days and 10 nights on an unforgettable dive cruise (Plan see below).



Overall, the safari is all about big fish encounters. To this end, the itinerary. Whale sharks as well as manta rays, possibly schools of hammerhead sharks, as well as many other shark species will accompany us on this tour. Of course, macro lovers are also well catered for. In addition to all these diving shark lights, there are of course also great shore excursions planned, so it will be a great adventure below and above water.



Tour Itinerary

I am very happy that I was able to put together a fantastic tour with the team of Amaya Explorer to offer you unique diving experiences.

Raja Ampat, a remote island paradise in West Papua (Indonesia), is considered one of the most biodiverse marine areas in the world. Over 1,500 islands, karst cliffs, turquoise lagoons and



largely untouched coral reefs make the region a dream destination for divers, snorkelers and nature photographers.

The main towns are Waisai on Waigeo Island and Sorong on the mainland, which is usually the arrival hub. From there, you can continue by speedboat to resorts, homestays or liveaboard ships. Accommodation ranges from simple, family-run bungalows on

stilts right by the sea to comfortable, full-board dive resorts.

Under water, you can expect steep walls, colorful soft corals, huge schools of fish, manta rays, sharks, turtles and, with a bit of luck, wobbegongs (carpet sharks). Popular spots are located around the islands of Misool, Gam, Kri and Fam. Snorkelers will also find an impressive variety in the house reef.

This diver itinerary covers the top two regions of Raja Ampat: the northern area around Wayag/Kawe and Dampier Strait, and the southern area around Misool.

In the north, you'll dive around Waigeo, Kawe, and Wayag on current-rich reefs and shallow plateaus with large schools of fish, bumphead parrotfish, reef sharks, and often manta rays. Well-known spots in the Dampier Strait (e.g. around Kri, Mansuar, Gam) offer strong currents, densely overgrown coral reefs and enormous fish density - ideal for big fish encounters and spectacular drift dives.



The southern section leads to the island world of Misool, famous for its colorful soft corals, caves and overhangs. Iconic dive sites such as "The Candy Store", "Boo Windows" and other spots with extremely dense vegetation, macro life, but also regular sharks and large schools are located here.



Land excursions

Between colorful dives and relaxing hours on board, shore excursions in Raja Ampat offer an impressive addition to the underwater experience. Spectacular viewpoints such as Piaynemo or the Love Lagoon, quiet lagoons and jellyfish lakes, traditional villages such as Arborek as well as excursions into the rainforest or to rivers such as the Kali Biru show you the whole scenic and cultural diversity of the region. This will not only give you insights into the extraordinary nature, but also into the life of the local communities - an important building block for an all-round varied travel experience.

Lagoon Balbulol

The Balbulol Lagoon in the Misool area is one of the most photogenic stops on this route. Between steeply rising karst islands, a labyrinth of turquoise pools, narrow passages and hidden bays opens up – often absolutely windless and as smooth as glass.

Love Lagoon

The Love Lagoon is one of the most famous postcard views of Raja Ampat. From above, a turquoise lagoon, surrounded by densely overgrown karst islands, clearly forms the shape of a heart – hence the name.



Jellyfish Lake



Jellyfish Lake in Raja Ampat is an enclosed marine lagoon where a population of largely biteless/harmless jellyfish has developed. Unlike in open reefs, you can swim here - with mask and snorkel - among thousands of jellyfish in the warm, calm water. Certainly not for everyone, but a unique experience guaranteed...

Piaynemo

Piaynemo (often called "Piaynemo Viewpoint") is one of the most famous viewpoints in the northern Raja Ampat. From a wooden platform, look out over dozens of small, forested karst islands scattered in a turquoise lagoon – one of the region's classic postcard views.



Arborek Village

Arborek is a small, traditional village on a tiny sandy island in the heart of the Dampier Strait and is considered one of Raja Ampat's most accessible and friendly villages. As a rule, visitors are greeted by the inhabitants and then guided through their village. A great opportunity to get to know local customs and customs. There is also a great house reef which is waiting for our visit.

Blue River / Kali Biru

Kali Biru ("Blue River") is a crystal-clear freshwater river in the jungle of West Papua, whose waters glow intensely turquoise blue. It is often visited as an excursion from Sorong or Waigeo and is a nice contrast to the sea tours in Raja Ampat.

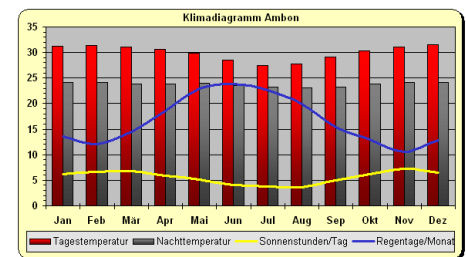

Entry into Indonesia is possible with a German passport (valid for more than 6 months) for a period of 30 days. A free visit visa is issued directly at the airport. An extension is not possible without leaving the country. The visa is free of charge.
